Start of the Scholarship Program of the MUFG NFUAJ East Japan Earthquake Recovery and Scholarship Fund

(The scholarship program for eligible infants expected to enter elementary school in April of 2012-2014 will be implemented from 2012) * Iwate Prefecture, Miyagi Prefecture, Fukushima Prefecture, Aomori Prefecture, Ibaraki Prefecture, Tochigi Prefecture and Chiba Prefecture. Please note that the large number of residents of the Tokyo Metropolitan area who had difficulty traveling home at the time of the earthquake are not eligible for this scholarship program.
3. Provision of	An initial lump sum payment of \(\frac{\pma}{100,000}\), along with a monthly payment of
scholarships	¥20,000 for each month of enrolment in elementary school, middle school or high school. There is no requirement to repay scholarship funds.
4. Scholarship period	From the start of payment until the beneficiary graduates from high school (however the age limit is until the 20 th birthday of beneficiaries). Payments will be retroactive from April 2011.
5. Application method	The parent or guardian of eligible pupils and students should apply to the school at which the pupil or student is enrolled.
6. Application period	Please apply to the school of enrolment by Wednesday July 20, 2011.

8. Notification of results	Starting from the latter part of July applicants will be notified via the school of enrollment.
9. Account for receipt of funds	Funds will be paid to the account of the parent or guardian of eligible elementary and middle school pupils. For eligible high school students payments will be made to the student's account. Payments will be made quarterly.
