# Start of the FY 2014 Scholarship Program of the MUFG NFUAJ East Japan Earthquake Recovery and Scholarship Fund

4. Scholarship period	From the start of payment until the beneficiary graduates from high school (however
	payments will be made until the 20 <sup>th</sup> birth month of beneficiaries). Payments will be made
	from April 2014.
5. Application method	The parent or guardian of eligible children should arrange to receive stamped application

# 2. Healthy Growth Program

# (1) 2<sup>nd</sup> TOMODACHI·MUFG International Exchange Program

For about 2 weeks from June 29, 2013 to July 14 2013, 26 students and 4 educators from Southern California, travelled to Japan, where they visited schools in the affected area and exchanged with 17 students who had participated in 1<sup>st</sup> TOMODACHI•MUFG International Exchange Program from Miyagi Prefecture, including 6 scholarship students.

#### (2) Support Event

In December 2013, 31 scholarship students were invited to Charity Soccer 2013, organized by Japan Pro-Footballers Association.

### (3) Japan Volleyball League Organization (V League) - Volleyball School

From December 2013 to January 2014, approximately 140 students participated in a Volleyball School supported by V League.

## 3. Flower-replanting Program

The Flower-replanting Program was held 12 times between April 2013 and November 2013 in Iwate, Miyagi and Fukushima Prefectures. A total of 13,000 plants were donated to 15 elementary, middle and high schools etc. in earthquake-affected regions. The program will continue to be held in the future.

### 4. Volunteer Program

About 350 executives and staff from BTMU and MUFG group companies participated as volunteers in running program 3, listed above.
